We're happy to share the latest updates from the DigiGap project following our Second Transnational Meeting, which took place in Timișoara, Romania, on 1–2 July 2024. Hosted with warmth and enthusiasm, the meeting brought together project partners to assess progress, finalise WP2, and plan in detail for the upcoming WP3 activities.



Finalisation of WP2 – Research & Module Development

The meeting marked the successful conclusion of Work Package 2 (WP2), focused on researching digital skills gaps and developing the DigiCompBook. During the sessions:

- Partners presented their National Reports summarising the digital skills challenges in each country.
- The Common Report, compiled by ALL Association, synthesised key insights and laid the foundation for future actions.
- School partners shared the results of local focus groups, providing real feedback from students and communities.
- Each organisation presented beta versions of the DigiCompBook modules, sparking a fruitful discussion on how to finalise and improve them.

Planning WP3 – Digital Change Agents

With WP2 successfully wrapped up, the focus shifted to Work Package 3 (WP3): Digital Change Agents, which will equip students to become digital trainers in their schools and families.

During the meeting, we:

- Reviewed the overall structure and timeline of WP3.
- Agreed on the format and content of the Introductory Manual for student training, which will be drafted by DSG Consultores.
- Discussed the “Ready, Steady, Go” workshops, which each school will host to train students as digital ambassadors.
- Set clear deadlines for the translation of materials and implementation across all participating countries.

The consortium is committed to empowering young people to take an active role in digital education within their communities.

Collaboration, Quality & Dissemination

As part of the Timișoara meeting, partners also took time to review progress on project dissemination and quality assurance. Tero presented the full suite of dissemination materials developed so far and encouraged all partners to intensify visibility efforts. Meanwhile, SEDA shared the updated evaluation and quality plan, reinforcing our shared commitment to transparency, learning, and continuous improvement.

A productive discussion was also held on how to make the DigiCompBook modules more adaptable to local contexts without losing coherence across the consortium. Cultural relevance, age-appropriate language, and practical tools remain central to the project’s impact.

Looking Ahead

The meeting concluded on a high note with strong consensus on next steps. Partners are now preparing for the launch of WP3 activities, which will begin implementation in mid-2025. The next in-person consortium meeting is scheduled for 11–12 December 2025 in Kraków, Poland, where we will review WP3 progress and set the stage for the final phase of the project.
